The Grandparents Scam

Between January 1st, and August 2nd, 2022, the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre has received over 13,293 reports having to do with the grandparent emergency scam.

This scam involves fraudsters contacting elderly people, or other family members, and stating that their grandchild or family member is in danger. The fraudster will claim that they are police, a law enforcement officer, or a lawyer, and then inform who they are calling that their family member is ill, was in an accident, was charged with a crime, or is in legal trouble.

The caller will then ask victims to make a bail payment, pay legal fees, or make a payment to prevent their loved one from going to jail. If the victim agrees to pay the requested amount, the scammer will tell them to mail in the funds, or sometimes even show up at their residence disguised as a courier or representative of the court, and collect the money in person.

It is important to be aware of the potential warning signs, and ways to avoid this scam:

- If you receive a suspicious phone call claiming your family member is in danger, hang up and call that person directly
- If the caller claims to be a police officer, hang up and call your local police department
- Be aware of what you are posting online, scammers often obtain personal information that they
 can use, through your online platforms
- Be aware of any suspicious calls where you are required to immediately pay some type of fee
- Be careful with calls that come from a caller ID that you recognize. Scammers often disguise the
 phone number they are calling from to make it look like a number that you recognize

If you receive a call like this, it is important that you report it to your local police department. It is also

important that you report to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre by phone, at 1-888-495-8501, or using the Fraud Reporting System.


Monthly Homicide Support Group

National Day of Remembrance and Action against Women - Ottawa Vigil

On December 6, 1989, 14 women were killed by a man in the engineering school at Montreal's Ecole Polytechnique. Parliament designated December 6 at the National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women.

December 6th, 2022 marks 33 years since this massacre.

Special Online Event

The Centre for Research & Education on Violence Against Women & Children at Western University is hosting a special online event that is presented by Pamela Cross, Erin Lee, Kirsten Mercer, and Prabhu Rajan.

The event will discuss a triple femicide case involving Carol Culleton, Anastasia Kuzyk, and Nathalie Warmerdam. In June 2022, a coroner's inquest developed recommendations for how deaths like this could be prevented in the future. The jury involved in this case came up with 86 recommendations for changes that could be made in the system.

Participants in this event will learn the facts of this case, details about the recommendations that were made, and ways of advocating for the implementation of these important recommendations.

The event will be hosted on November 17, 2022, from 1:00-3:00 pm EST.
